BACK GROUND

The Free Pentecostal Fellowship (FPFK) is an evangelical church registered in Kenya. It operates in 38 regions in Kenya and has over 2000 congregations, with a combined membership of over 350,000. FPFK was formed in 1977 out of a common fellowship by the Norwegian and Swedish missionaries in 1950s and 1960s, respectively. FPFK'S vision is a Pentecostal movement meeting the needs of the society holistically based on Christian values. The church's mission is to preach the Word of God to all nations in preparation for the second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ by reaching out and establishing churches which can meet the spiritual, economic, and social needs of the people through evangelism, education, training and social economic activities based on Christian values. Our core values are love, integrity, obedience, unity, humility, stewardship and service. FPFK plays an active role as a civil society through membership to Act alliance Kenya forum and National Council of Churches of Kenya (NCCK). FPFK implements several programs and project across the country, the FPFK Resilience Program Supported by SIDA through PMU Sweden

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This initiative is anchored on the FPFK Resilience program with the goal to position FPFK and her local churches as change agents and active advocates for societal transformation. The aim of this initiative is to position FPFK as an active advocate, redefining the church mission with a focus on community transformation. By working with FPFK Local Churches, FPFK envisions communities able to identify their problems, find lasting solutions and taking actions and becoming self-reliant. The main objective remains to mobilize and empower FPFK local churches and their communities to work together, take responsibility for their own development to achieve holistic change. The expected result shall be Communities develop skills, attitudes and knowledge that enable them become self-reliant and resilient, learning to identify and solve problems facing them, using what they have, as well as collaborating with other stakeholders through networking and advocacy to address problems within and beyond their capacity.

JOB DESCRIPTION

To facilitate, coordinate and monitor FPFK church and community mobilization activities across all FPFK Regions and ensure that local churches in all FPFK regions are envisioned, followed-up and mobilized to work with their local communities in holistic development, address their identified priority needs and take responsibility for their own development.

DUTIES:

- Mobilizing local churches and communities to address community problems using their own resources.
- Planning and conducting /organizing training and capacity building activities for the church and community leaders in identified areas of need.
- Overseeing, coordinating and monitoring church and community development initiatives
- Producing regular short-term and long-term plans of work to be done in the area of church and community transformation
- Regular follow- up and data collection from the churches and communities.
- Producing periodic progress reports as required by the Programme
- Filing and documentation of all work, activities and information related to church for community transformation
- Planning and organizing exposure trips for the local churches and communities for capacity building.
- Networking with relevant stakeholders at all levels, including government, churches, NGOs, and Community level leadership.
- Representing FPFK at various forums relevant to FPRK resilience Program work in the Central Region, when required.
